ANNEX 3: SMALLVILLE ACTIVITY¹

Optional activity (lesson 2, section B)

All instructions are to the teacher, apart from those marked 'Handout for Students'

Activity aims:

- To allow students to understand multi-perspectivity through a practical decisionmaking exercise
- To provide students with an every day, practical example of divergent perspectives based on incomplete information or the manner in which the person giving the information chooses to select which details to include
- To encourage students to think not only about the information itself and what this
 tells them about the events / facts / issues, but ALSO about the person providing
 the information and why they have decided to share it

The Activity:

Divide the class into 3 groups.

Give each group gets one of the following 3 sheets of information for a tourist destination called 'Smallville'. Tell them that they are 3 separate groups of tourists, all visiting 'Smallville'. Tell them that all of the groups will receive information about the SAME hotels and each group has to decide where to stay when they arrive in Smallville.

What they don't know is that while all of the groups receive information about the SAME HOTELS, the information about the hotels is different. (written by a different magazine / reviewer / etc).

Working within their groups, but not discussing with the other groups, each group has to decide where to stay.

They present their decision to the rest of the class and justify why they have chosen that particular place to stay.

As they present, other groups will probably interject immediately as one group presents ("What, why would you stay there...yes, it is a wonderful old mansion, but it is totally falling apart and the swimming pool is empty!".... / " Yes, it is a 5 star hotel, but it is also a construction site....why would you stay somewhere somewhere noisy and dusty!?")— as they do this, encourage the original group to look at the source — the reviewer- and also the date of the review to see if the students can understand the point of the exercise without the teacher having to tell them.

If other students don't comment, try to ask questions to encourage the 'listening' groups to do so 'actively' and to challenge the decisions of the other groups. Ask "is anyone lying? Do the facts contradict each other? Who has written this review? What made you decide to stay at place a) rather than place c)?"

The students will quickly see that no lie has been told in any of the pieces of information, but simply that the whole 'story' is not revealed.

By presenting different parts of the same 'truth' in each review, a different image is put forward, which affects their decisions about where to stay.

Encourage students to look at the date of the publication of the magazine / review. Encourage them to look at the name of the magazine / publication and see what they can infer about the person writing the review and why they would write such divergent reviews about the same place.

Get them to figure out that when assessing sources, they need to also think about what information HASN'T been included (as well as biases) and also to think about why (e.g. in a Tweet or in a newspaper column, details are often removed, not to deliberately hide something, but simply because they don't fit).

They must also think about their own ideas, preferences and thoughts and consider how these affect their decision to stay at one place rather than another.

a) 5 star hotel: "The restaurant is excellent"

a) 5 star hotel: "Wonderful hotel. Perfect in every way. Gorgeous NEW rooms, great food and lovely staff".

b) **campsite:** "Amazing campsite with its own solar-powered shuttle bus that takes you there from the airport, free wifi and next to a gorgeous river with loads of funky sports, things to do and with excellent recycling facilities. Highly recommended"
